- [750] Jan de Lichte, Brewery: Glazen-Toren, Erpe-mere. A full-bodied version of its witbier contemporary, this imperial style is amazingly spicy and robust, with hints of cardamom, citrus and brown sugar. A perfect summer beer! (750 ml, ABV 7%) \$24.95
- [750] Kasteel Tripel, Brewery: Van Honsebrouck, Ingelmunster. A fairly large white head and pale yellow color greets you like a smile. Boasts an angelic blend of citrus and spice. The alcohol flavor is slight for a beer of this strength. (750 ml, ABV 11%) \$21
- [750] Moinette Blonde, Brewery: Brasserie Dupont, Tourpes-Leuze. A deceptively smooth strong pale ale that perfectly blends malt sweetness with the fruit of apples & pears. Dry and crisp with a sweetness from start to finish. Notable hop notes. (750 ml, ABV 8.5%) \$26.95
- [750] Ondineke Tripel, Brewery: Glazen Toren, Erpe-Mere. Nicely carbonated, creamy, with a slightly dry finish and spicy undertones from one of Al's favorite breweries! (750 ml, ABV 8.5%) \$27.95
- [750] Sans Culottes, Brewery: La Choulette, . Much revered for its champagne like qualities, this one has a slightly fruity and delicate flavour that remains deep & utterly satisfying. But please, keep your pants on. (750 ml, ABV 7%) \$24.95

Fruit & Funky

Bacchus, Brewery: Van Honsebrouck, Ingelmunster. This Flanders red ale is a milder version than some we have tasted, but still brings a sour cherry flavour and tartness that is undeniably pleasant. (11.2 oz, ABV 4.5%) \$11.5

Duchesse de Bourgogne, Brewery: Brouwerij Verhaeghe, Vichtenaar. This refreshing Flanders Red Ale is matured in oak casks; smooth with a rich texture and interplay of passion fruit, and chocolate, and a long, dry and acidic finish. One of our favorites! (11.2 oz, ABV 6%) \$11.5

Éphémère Apple, Brewery: Unibroue, Chambly, Quebec. Don't let the sweet bouquet of granny smith apples and nutmeg fool you into thinking it is overly sweet. A light drinker with thirst-quenching carbonation. (12 oz, ABV 5.5%) \$6.95

Kasteel Rouge, Brewery: Van Honsebrouck, Ingelmunster. Ch-ch-ch-ch-cherry bomb. This one is a blend of Kasteel's brown ale and sour cherries. Dessert-y sweet, and a smart choice to turn that someone around who says they hate beer. Blow their mind with this cherry-delicious treat. (11.2 oz, ABV 8%) \$9.25

Lindemans Framboise, Brewery: Lindemans, Vleezenbeek. Michael Jackson once said "A framboise fills the air with its bouquet, and is even more delicate in its palate and finish. A seducer would be tempted to engage it, and a sexist to deem it the most feminine of beers. ", and we believe him! Raspberries, yum! (12 oz, ABV 2.5%) \$11.5

Lindemans Peche, Brewery: Lindemans, Vleezenbeek. This delicious lambic will leave you feeling mighty peachy! Not too sweet or sour, just a perfectly refreshing beverage. (12 oz, ABV 2.5%) \$11.5

White

Blanche de Bruxelles, Brewery: Lefebvre, Quenast. Harmonious taste of malt, wheat and orange rind. And the Mannequin Pis right on the bottle! Pour this one carefully to leave the fruit and spices in the bottle. (11.2 oz, ABV 4%) \$6.5

Dupont Saison, Brewery: Brasserie Dupont, Tourpes-Leuze. Creamy and full-bodied, this one is not over-carbonated, but just a lovely saison style. Great drinkability, the theme is refreshment, balance and harmony of flavour. Saisons were originally brewed in the French-speaking Walloon region of Belgium, to quench farm worker's thirst. (12.7 oz, ABV 6.5%) \$9.95

Hoegaarden Wit, Brewery: InBev, Hoegaarden. One nice drinkin' beer. Pale & hazy, white-yellow color. Dense white head. A wheaty-apple-like, tartness, herbal spicy notes, with lots of coriander, orange-like fruitiness, and honey sweetness. (11.2 oz, ABV 4.9%) \$5.95

St. Bernardus Witbier, Brewery: Brouwerij St Bernardus, Watou. This ale is very pale (whitish-yellow color) and quite hazy. The head is white and dense. In aroma, it has a wheaty, apple-like, tartness; herbal-spicy notes with coriander and orangey fruitness and honeyish sweetness. (11.2 oz, ABV 5.5%) \$8.95

Pale

Achel (Trappist), Brewery: De Achelse Kluis, Hamont-Achel. This rare Trappist is intense in character, a slight touch of caramel, bitter and a little fruity, some green banana. (330ml, ABV 8%) \$12.95

Bavik Pils, Brewery: Bavik, Bavikhove. This heavily carbonated session beer refreshes with a nice balance of sweetness and herbal notes. (11.2 oz, ABV 5.2%) \$6.25

Brainless, Brewery: Epic, . Super solid Belgian style with a pleasant funk that delivers a barley malt extravaganza. (22 oz, ABV 8.7%) \$12

Chimay Cinq Cent (Trappist), Brewery: Abbaye de Scourmont, Forges-Les-Chimay. An authentic Trappist brew. Also called Chimay White. Hoppy and dry, with a firm body, slender for its gravity and a quenching hint of acidity. It is pale in color, but full of perfect grape flavour riding on just the right carbonation. (11.2 oz, ABV 8%) \$11.5

Corsendonk Agnus Dei, Brewery: Brasserie du Bocq, Oud-Turnhout. Light, dry and delicate, with a great deal of finesse. At first slightly citrusy-fruity on the palate, it finishes with a distinctive hop character. This "methode champenoise" beer will mature in the bottle for up to three years, becoming softer, clearer, and drier on the palate. (11.2 oz, ABV 8.1%) \$8.95

De Koninck Ale, Brewery: De Koninck, Antwerpen. Light grain, grassy hops, and a pleasantly thin head. Entirely drinkable. (11.2 oz, ABV 5%) \$6.25

Delerium Tremens, Brewery: Huyghe, Melle. Elected as best beer in the world! The name speaks for itself. The color is golden, and the head is creamy and light. The aftertaste is fruity, almost cherry. Delerium Tremens has a big body, a rich mouthful, and a long sweet aftertaste. (11.2 oz, ABV 8.5%) \$9.25

Duvel, Brewery: Duvel Moortgat, Puurs. We believe this may be the perfect specimen. Expect a complex and powerful ale, yet delicate with rounded flavors and big, billowy, rocky, white head. This one is called "Devil" for a reason! (11.2 oz, ABV 8.5%) \$9.25

Gouden Carolus Hopsinjoor, Brewery: Het Anker, Mechelen. Golden yellow with a hoppy aroma, a gentle but bitter aftertaste. The name "Hopsinjoor" is a play on the 4 hops used in this brew and op-signoorke. Op-signoorke is a short fat man with a mustache, who symbolizes the eternal drunk that his wife left for cheating on her. During parades, he is tossed by his 'punishers' on a large canvas thrown into the air. (11.2 oz, ABV 6%) \$9.95

Grimbergen Blonde, Brewery: Abbaye Alken Maes, Alken. Bittersweet & spicy, this is a full bodied beer with a warm aftertaste. (11.2 oz, ABV 7.7%) \$6.25

Leffe Blond, Brewery: Abbaye de Leffe, Dinant. Orange-like palette with a nut-like and creamy structure. Smooth, full & spicy taste, powerful aftertaste and spicy undertone. (11.2 oz, ABV 6.6%) \$5.95

Saxo, Brewery: La Brasserie Caracole, Falmignoul. Light, fruity and vegetable nose with green apple flavours. Flexible and refined, with a strong but delicate bitterness. (11.2 oz, ABV 7.5%) \$10.95

St Bernardus Tripel, Brewery: Brouwerij St Bernardus, Watou. Spiciness that borders on intense: citrus clove aromas lead the charge to a wonderfully balanced taste. A must try for any self-respecting beer lover ... (11.2 oz, ABV 8%) \$9.5

Stella Artois, Brewery: Stella Artois, Leuven. The character of a bold hop and a vague impression of recently mowed hay. Fresh, full taste with a fine bitterness. Full bodied, but exceptionally thirst-quenching. (11.2 oz, ABV 5.2%) \$5.50;

Val Dieu blonde, Brewery: Val Dieu, . Sparkling carbonation delivers breadly caramel goodness in a near perfect example of the style. (11.2 oz, ABV 6%) \$9

Amber

Chimay Rouge (Trappist), Brewery: Abbaye de Scourmont, Forges-Les-Chimay. An authentic Trappist brew. Also referred to as Première, this brew pours with a creamy head and beautiful coppery color, and gives off a light, fruity apricot aroma produced by the fermentation. (11.2 oz, ABV 7%) \$10.5

Gouden Carolus Ambrio, Brewery: Het Anker, Mechelen. The recipe dates back to the 14th century. Combines the full bodied character of a dark beer with the freshness of blonde. This beer is highly aromatic, and offers a nice balance of spice. (11.2 oz, ABV 8%) \$9.95

Maredsous Tripel 10, Brewery: Abbaye Duvel, Puurs. Utterly harmonious. Lemon and honey give way to hints of banana and caramel. Quite a ride, delivered with a real punch! (11.2 oz, ABV 10%) \$9.95

Maudite , Brewery: Unibroue, Chambly, Quebec. "Cursed". Characterized by a robust maltiness and spiciness that is counterbalanced by an assertive crisp hop finish. (12 oz, ABV 8%) \$7.25

Orval (Trappist), Brewery: Brasserie d'Orval, Villers d'Orval. A triple-fermented Trappist ale with a lively effervescence. Creamy tan head. Pale orange-amber liquid. Distinctive spicy, guava like and heady nose. Allspice palate with a slightly woody, bitter mouthful in the finish. Delectable! (11.2 oz, ABV 6.2%) \$11.5

Scaldis Bush Ambree, Brewery: Brasserie Dubuisson , Pipaix-Leuze. The Strongest One! Known as "Bush Beer" in Belgium, but do not be fooled! This Bush will REALLY kick your butt! Brewed since 1769 by Brasserie Dubuisson Freres, Papaix Hainut. (8.48 oz, ABV 12%) \$9.95

Trappistes Rochefort 6 (Trappist), Brewery: Brasserie de Rochefort (Abbaye de Notre Dame de Saint-Rémy),
Rochefort. Another complex Trappist brew, caramel, toffee, more buttery as it warms. (11.2 oz, ABV
7.5%) \$11.5

Westmalle Tripel (Trappist), Brewery: Abbaye de Westmalle, Westmalle. This Trappist brew has a dense, white head
that leaves very full lacework. It has a very aromatic, creamy body, with a distinctively clean, orange
life fruitiness in its deep, complex palate (11.2 oz, ABV 9%) \$12.95

Dark

Corsendonk Pater, Brewery: Brasserie du Bocq, Oud-Turnhout. Rich malty beer with some serious spice! Mild dark
fruit aromas and flavors. Mild hop bitterness with no lingering hop flavors. Let this one warm to
release all its beauty. (11.2 oz, ABV 7.5%) \$8.95

Gouden Carolus Classic, Brewery: Het Anker, Mechelen. A dark beer with a high density or thickness. Combines the
warmth of wine with the freshness of beer. (11.2 oz, ABV 8.5%) \$9.95

Grimbergen Dubbel, Brewery: Abbaye Alken Maes, Alken. Bready & sweet, this is a smooth and creamy drinker. (11.2
oz, ABV 6.5%) \$6.25

Leffe Brune, Brewery: Abbaye de Leffe, Dinant. Lower in kick yet remains flavorful, notes of chocolate and biscuits
define a very drinkable session beer. (11.2 oz, ABV 6.5%) \$5.95

Monk's Blood , Brewery: 21st Amendment Brewery, California. This limited edition winter brew was developed after
the brewers visited small traditional breweries in Belgium, and is named in honor of the Monks who
fast, and drink only beer. An unusual assortment of cinnamon, vanilla beans, and black mission figs,
and packed in a can! (12 oz, ABV 8.3%) \$6.25

Podge Belgian Imperial Stout, Brewery: Picobrouwerij Alvinne, Heule. Not a stout that you might expect, but hey -
this is a Belgian, after all. Starts with a hint of chocolate and sweet and finishes with traces of
coffee. Body is slightly creamy-chewy. And low in alcohol flavour for an ABV in the "oh yeah" range!
(11.2 oz, ABV 10.5%) \$10.95

Trappistes Rochefort 8 (Trappist), Brewery: Brasserie de Rochefort (Abbaye de Notre Dame de Saint-Rémy),
Rochefort. Michael's favorite Trappist! Has a deep red-brown color, a dense head, a more viscous
body, a profoundly fig-like palate, with notes of bitter chocolate in the finish. (11.2 oz, ABV 9.2%)
\$12.95

Malbec (Argentina). Arido vineyards. A full bodied, fruity spicy red. 22.95

Merlot (California). Heron vineyards. Proprietor Laely Heron selects the grapes and uses partner wineries to bottle for her. 26.95

Pinot Noir (California). Angeline vineyards. Selected from premier vines in Mendocino, Sonoma and Santa Barbara. 29.95

Shiraz (Australia). Bulletin Place vineyards. Bright youthful purples and dark red. Mixed berries with peppery, spicy overtones. 24.95

Rosé

Cabernet Sauvignon Rose (South Africa). Mulderbosch vineyards. Yes, it's pink, but it's not sweet. Rosé is a bistro favorite all across Europe. Alas, it seems only the cool kids drink it here! 26.95

Sparkling

Blanc de Blanc (France). Simonet vineyards. Celebrate any occasion with this lovely dry sparkler from France. 24.95

White

Chenin Blanc/Viognier (California). Pine Ridge vineyards. The perfect patio sipping wine! 27.95

Napa Chardonnay (California). Annabella vineyards. Chardonnay from the heart of the Napa Valley. 27.95

Pinot Grigio (Italy). Prendo vineyards. Crisp and refreshing, from the Dolomite region of Northern Italy. 24.95

Riesling (Germany). Dr. L vineyards. Just what the doctor ordered for those who dig sweetness in their wine. 26.95

Sauvignon Blanc (New Zealand). Ponga vineyards. Named for the Maori word for the Silver Ferns indigenous to New Zealand, Ponga Sauvignon Blanc is typical of wines from the Marlborough region, with ripe tropical flavors and a hint of peach. 25.95

Can't decide? Here are some of our current staff selections...

Al for his latest brew pick, chooses **Bacchus**. The Flemish red style is drinkable and refreshing, and just odd enough to keep him interested, at least for now... Bacchus, Brewery: Van Honsebrouck, Ingelmunster. (11.2 oz, ABV 4.5%) \$11.5

As the humidity attacks once again **Jacque** has decided her warm weather goto is to be Delerium Tremens. Not only is the beer sparkly and refreshingly delicious, but the 9% kick, the white bottle and the adorable pink elephant that adorns it make the whole package difficult to resist. Delerium Tremens, Brewery: Huyghe, Melle. (11.2 oz, ABV 8.5%) \$9.25

Michael, of course, goes for a Trappist beer that is rather difficult to obtain. If we have any **Trappistes Rochefort 8**, with just the right balance of complexity and alcohol, snap this one up. It will be a while before we are able to get more. Brewery: Abbaye de Notre Dame de Saint-Rémy, Rochefort. (11.2 oz, ABV 9.2%) \$12.95

Jesse J has grown rather fond of **Scaldis Bush Ambrée**, which packs the highest punch in the cooler. But he has also learned that two is his absolute limit, unless of course he wants to endure more teasing from the rest of us. Brewery: Brasserie Dubuisson, Pipaix-Leuze. (8.48 oz, ABV 12%) \$9.95

Jessica chooses a Canadian Belgian-style : **Ephemere**. While the nose on this one is all sweet sour green apple, the taste is surprisingly unsweet and definitely refreshing. Very unique ! Brewery: Unibroue, Chambly, Quebec. (12 oz, ABV 8%) \$7.25
